Dear parishioners and friends of St. Pius V and St. Joseph parish communities,

Today as we honor Mickey for her many years of service, I want to provide you with a brief introduction to our new Business Administrator and a little more detail about changes to the role.



BJ Peters has been hired and has started orientation to the position. BJ lives in Hastings and is a member of St. John the Baptist in Vermillion. She has worked in Healthcare for 33 years and has also run her own business successfully for 11 years. The interview committee strongly recommended her based on her excellent skills of; organization, knowledge, communication, writing, management, and supervision. She is married and has 4 children and 4 grandchildren. She has a strong faith. As a child she spoke of how her family did much work in the church (mom was organist and father was an usher and general handy man) and she always wanted to emulate the way her parents gave of their time and talents to the church.

BJ will be working 25 hours per week. This change in hours is based on a review of the business administrator position. With the change in computer capabilities, staff support and other factors, a decision was made to make this a 25 hour per week position. We will establish some regular hours for BJ with the understanding there will need to be some flexibility based on the needs of our congregation.

In the coming weeks, please stop in and introduce yourself to BJ. She is very excited to learn more about St. Pius and meet each of you.

I also want to express my gratitude to everyone at both St. Pius V and St Joseph communities and friends who supported me in my role as pastor for the last two years. I am grateful to God for our fruitful ministry in such a brief time. I am also grateful for the ministry received; many of you went out of your way to care for me, and offered me your friendship. I feel lucky! I am also grateful for new leaders and volunteers who stepped up to the plate and for your willingness to dialogue when facing new questions and/or challenges in parish ministry. If I were to be asked to summarize my pastoral experience, I will use the words “hope and wonderment.” I do not deny it, I had good days and bad days, but I was never bored!

Some of you have asked me if there is a pressing reason for my sudden reassignment. In my conversation with Archbishop John C. Nienstedt; he made it clear to me he was asking me to consider serving in a bilingual community with both English/Spanish populations, and a school. He said, “Fr. Ortega, I am asking you this for the good of the Archdiocese.” So, I sought obedience to Archbishop. I understand this transition will not be easy, and for this purpose I am asking you to keep me in your prayers as I keep you in mine. Thank You!



Happy Fathers' Day! Thank you to those who take their role as fathers seriously. There are many studies about families available, comparing single parent homes to those with both parents present, married couples to non-married, and even same sex parents to male/female. One can find a study to say what they want it to say, to support their experience or their preference. But almost all show the value of loving parents responsibly raising their children to become productive adults. Furthermore, they often show that having a married couple, committed to one another and to their children, with both a male and a female present, provides the best situation.



Here is some of the most recent information I have been able to find from what I believe are reliable sources:

□ **80 percent of the children** who were "post-war generation" could expect to grow up with two biological parents who were married to each other. Today, only about 50 percent of our children will spend their entire childhood in an intact family. 24 million children in America sleep in homes where their natural fathers do not live.

□ **In 2000, 27 percent of US families** with minor children were headed by a single parent. Divorce and non-marital childbearing have become commonplace and have dramatically altered children's lives. Approximately half of the children in the United States will live in a single parent home at some point before age 18 years.

□ **Nationally, 40 percent of children** whose fathers live outside the home have no contact with them. The other 60 percent had contact an average of 69 days during the year. 26 percent of absent fathers live in a different state than their children.

□ **Children from father-absent homes** are five times more likely to live in poverty, 3 times more likely to fail in school, two to three times more likely to develop emotional and behavioral problems, and three times more likely to commit suicide.

Again, it seems that fatherhood is very important. Support men in those roles, encourage them to be responsible, teach them to respect women and children, and be good examples for them.

We are back in ordinary ("counted") time, but for three Sundays running we have special feasts. Today is Holy Trinity Sunday, where we reflect on the central mystery of God, that God is a community of persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Next Sunday we focus on the Eucharist, with the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. Finally, on June 29 we have another

solemnity, that of Sts. Peter and Paul. When this feast falls on a Sunday, it takes precedence even over the Sunday. In the coming weeks we also celebrate the Birth of John the Baptist on June 24 (the only saint where we observe both his birth and death), and Friday, June 27 is the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

As you know, a number of depositions have been taken in preparation for a sexual abuse case involving Thomas Adamson, a now defrocked priest, regarding an alleged abuse around 1980 in a case that will come before the court in the coming months. Adamson did indeed abuse many children during his priesthood. He was finally removed from ministry in 1984 and later laicized. All the depositions are available through the Archdiocesan website, www.archspm.org. While the questions in the depositions rarely have anything to do with Adamson, focusing more on more recent cases, it does give some information about the process of depositions, gathering testimony, and some insight into how these cases were handled over the years.

We have received word from Sr. Tresa Margret and Sr. Noel that they have arrived safely in India and are at their final destination.

The Most Holy Trinity

Scientists at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York released a study about a year ago in which they were sure they could identify the particular part of the brain that controls the feeling of love. A small area called the caudate becomes very active when thoughts of love occur during an MRI brain scan. The doctors' conclusions were that love isn't an emotion; it is a drive, similar to hunger or thirst. If only they had looked in their subjects' hearts.

"For God so loved the world?" The very first few words of today's Gospel reading from John are usually enough for most people to finish the passage from memory. But take a moment and study those six words; realize how much God loves us, and then think about how great that love is when God is willing to allow his only son to die for us and our sins.

And through that death and resurrection God gives to us the completion of the Holy Trinity, the most central mystery of the Christian faith and Christian life (CCC 261). God truly wants only happiness for us; his love is not an exclusionary love meant for only a few, but for us all. Today, remember the gift of the Holy Spirit, the gift of God's only son, and the gift of God's love, all three in one.

Q Why does the priest break off a particle of the host and drop it in the chalice?

A What you are describing happens during the Communion Rite after the breaking of the bread, and just before the Lamb of God. It is called "commingling" and dates back many centuries. In the early church, there was only one eucharistic celebration in each city on Sunday. The entire Christian community gathered together and the bishop celebrated the Eucharist. As Christianity grew, it became physically impossible to gather for one liturgy and Mass was celebrated throughout the area. The presider or priest was appointed by the bishop. A small portion of the host consecrated by the bishop was taken to each of the eucharistic celebrations over which the priest was presiding. This fraction was mingled into the chalice.

Today the priest breaks off a small fraction of the larger host used at Mass and places it into the chalice with the prayer: "May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it." The commingling symbolizes the Lord's resurrection. In death, body and blood are often separated, but in life they are united. This small symbol serves to remind us that the sacrifice of Jesus is one that gives us all life. In the Mass, we join ourselves to his death, so that we might also rise with him to life.






